The Commodity Supplemental Program (CSFP) St. Louis Area Foodbank supplemental food source for

seniors age 60 and older who fall within 130% of the federal poverty guidelines—seniors may participate in this program while also receiving food assistance via food SNAP pantries, meals on wheels, and/or stamps). The Foodbank partners with an organization that elects to administer the CSFP boxes to qualified seniors. Millstadt Township Senior Services would receive a once a month free delivery of free boxes to be distributed to the seniors signed up for the program; each box contains about 16 shelf stable items, plus cheese. The program does require some administrative work including, application sign up and verification of seniors, maintenance of sign-in sheets, and re-certification of participants that may be conducted verbally every 6 months.

March For Meals Campaign

Millstadt Mayor Mike Todd, Smithton Mayor Ray Klein and Smithton Township Supervisor Bill Weber helped deliver meals to homebound seniors last week during the annual March for Meals Campaign.

"It's a national campaign, and it's just to get more awareness for the public that it is out there and it's available to people and mayor of each town endorse it," said Patty Evansco, who coordinates the local Meals on Wheels program for Millstadt Township Senior Services. "I think the participants really enjoy seeing the mayors volunteer to deliver the meals."

"I think it really boosts morale and lets people know that officials care

what happens (to) the public in our area," she said. There are 15 volunteers who deliver Meals on Wheels at one point or another during the year, and the number of recipients varies from 40 to 45, Evansco said is good for such small communities.

On March 22, 1972, President Richard Nixon signed the amendment to the Older Americans Act of 1965 and established the national Meals on Wheels program. Meals on Wheels programs have come together each March for the past 15 years, to celebrate this collaboration of local community organizations, businesses, all levels of government and compassionate individuals to ensure that our seniors are not forgotten. Without support from programs like Meals on Wheels, millions of seniors are forced to prematurely leave their homes for more (L-R) Quinn alternatives. The dedicated staff costly volunteers, who deliver these meals each week across the country, provide a vital lifeline and connection, which are sometimes all it takes to keep our senior neighbors at home.

At the present time we are only able to go to Freeburg and Smithton once a week. The clients get one warm meal and four frozen meals. If we had 4 volunteers to each take a day then a warm meal could be delivered every day. Please call Patty at (618) 476-3731 if you would be interested in volunteering.



and we recently received our 2017 updated Manual. During the coming months I will be sharing with you some information that I feel is important and informational.

Organization and Administration of the SHIP Program: SHIP was initiated in July of 1988 by the Illinois Department of Insurance in response to the needs of Illinois' senior citizens regarding their health insurance. In April of 2013, under Executive Order by the Governor, SHIP was transferred to the Illinois Department on Aging.

The organizational structure of SHIP consists of:

- The Illinois Department on Aging, which provides initial training, continuing education and ongoing support of SHIP counselors;
- The sponsoring organization (Millstadt Township Senior Services), which provides coordinators, office space and office support services;
- The coordinator (Patty Evansco), who is responsible for the administrative aspects of the SHIP program, which include publicizing SHIP services, recruiting scheduling counseling sessions volunteers, responding to counselors' needs; and
- Counselor Patty Evansco meets with clients individually to provide objective information about health insurance, advocacy assistance, or referral if appropriate.

The state is divided geographically into four separate SHIP regions: Cook County, Northern Illinois, Central Illinois and Southern Illinois. Within each region, counselors are organized in to units that serve a specific geographic area, usually designated by counties.




