The students also handled the promotion for the Library, creating and hanging flyers around town. The students will take turns monitoring the library every week throughout the year.

I recently attended a United Way/ AgeSmart seminar on "Assessing Community Needs" and found it very resourceful. Did you know that there are 10,000 people a day turning 65 in the United States? This is expected to continue for the next 10 years. The National Institute of Senior

Centers reported that there are currently 16,000 senior centers serving older adults in the US. It is estimated that nearly 10 million senior citizens utilize a senior center program or service every year.

These numbers look encouraging for the Senior Center business, but like here in Millstadt there is an ongoing challenge to have diversified programming and to modernize our facility to continue to attract older adults. The dilemma we face is a Catch-22 situation – how do we attract great numbers of older adults without modernizing and how do we modernize without adequate fiscal support?

My job in the next few years will be to create new programming for our senior center as well as develop new and innovative marketing plans so we can attract new participants. I will need to learn more about your likes, dislikes, and needs. We will need to establish beneficial partnerships with schools, community organizations and foundations.





Homecoming Parade 2017


Labor week-end, September 2 and 3 will again be the time for annual the Millstadt Homecoming including parades, food and refreshments. The theme for the 2017 parade

- 1/2 teaspoon cornstarch 2 1/2 cups sliced peaches

Food ank St. Louis Area Foodbank

The Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) is a supplemental food source for Idea, who fall within 130% of the

St. Louis Area Foodbank supplemental food source for seniors age 60 and older who fall within 130% of the federal poverty guidelines—seniors may participate in this program while also receiving food assistance via food pantries, meals on wheels, and/or SNAP (food stamps). The Foodbank partners with an organization that elects to administer the CSFP boxes to qualified seniors. Millstadt Township Senior Services would receive a once a month free delivery of free boxes to be distributed to the seniors signed up for the program; each box contains about 16 shelf stable items, plus cheese. The program does require some administrative work including, application sign up and verification of seniors, maintenance of sign-in sheets, and re-certification of participants that may be conducted verbally every 6 months.

Second, when you sign in and are registered we are able to submit your name to receive our grant money to help pay for the meals. A way to look at it is that if you aren't registered and signed in we can't send a bill for your lunch to the Area Agency on Aging.

and we recently received our 2017 updated Manual. During the coming months I will be sharing with you some information that I feel is important and informational.

Organization and Administration of the SHIP Program: SHIP was initiated in July of 1988 by the Illinois Department of Insurance in response to the needs of Illinois' senior citizens regarding their health insurance. In April of 2013, under Executive Order by the Governor, SHIP was transferred to the Illinois Department on Aging.

The organizational structure of SHIP consists of:

- The **Illinois Department on Aging**, which provides initial training, continuing education and ongoing support of SHIP counselors;
- The sponsoring organization (Millstadt Township Senior Services), which provides coordinators, office space and office support services;
- The **coordinator** (Patty Evansco), who is responsible for the administrative aspects of the SHIP program, which include publicizing SHIP services, recruiting volunteers, scheduling counseling sessions and responding to counselors' needs; and
- Counselor Patty Evansco meets with clients individually to provide objective information about health insurance, advocacy assistance, or referral if appropriate.

The state is divided geographically into four separate SHIP regions: Cook County, Northern Illinois, Central Illinois and Southern Illinois. Within each region, counselors are organized in to units that serve a specific geographic area, usually designated by counties.

Total Eclipse August 21, 2017

The last total solar eclipse to travel from west to east occurred in 1918. A total eclipse visible from the U.S. occurred in 1979. Every state will be able to see evidence of a partial eclipse, but not every state will be in the path of the total solar eclipse. A total solar eclipse is when the moon completely blocks the solar disk. During totality, it will get as dark as night outside and stars will appear.

The Great American Eclipse will be visible in Southern Illinois between 1:18 pm and 1:24 pm. Going through the Midwest, the 70 mile wide path of the total eclipse passes through the southern part of Illinois.

When viewing an eclipse, always wear proper protective eyewear and not look directly at the eclipse, as it could severely damage your eyes.

Not only are we able to supply necessary food, but the driver delivering the meal is able to ascertain how the client is getting along and share some companionship. We have a number of folks dedicated to providing these services. They give freely of their time and energy to deliver the meals, make contact with the recipient and report back to the Center. The majority of the "regular" drivers volunteer one day per week and most have said it is highly rewarding for them.

Lunch Program Lunch is served Monday through Friday at 12 noon. You must be 60 years of age or older to qualify for this program. It is appreciated that if you want lunch you call the center by 3:00 pm in order to sign up for lunch on the following day. When you come in you may sign yourself up for the next day. If you like, you may sign up for the entire week or month. If you know that you can not make it and you have signed up, please call and let us know that you will not be here and tell us when you will be back for lunch. 




