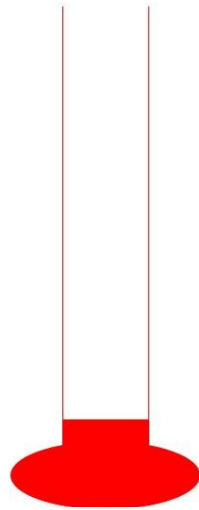

Our Senior Center has greatly benefitted from Don Mueller, Jerry Schmitz, Marlou Eckert, and Kathy Schaefer who are instrumental in getting "Senior Talk" out each month. Jean Colbert has taken charge of making sure our program units are entered into the computer so that we receive our grant funding each month and Mary Heberer does a great job making sure all the generous donors we have are sent a thank you.

As I stated before, they don't need kudos, but it does feel nice to be recognized from time to time. We have so many volunteers here every day and we could not be open without them.

Meals On Wheels Available In Your Area

Millstadt Township Senior Services will deliver more than 11,000 meals this year. But you're nourished by more than just the food. Our volunteer drivers make a personal connection and check that you are okay. Meals are provided based on need, not on income.

We deliver meals to seniors (60 years or older) who are homebound, no longer driving, unable to prepare food themselves, and do not have a caregiver that prepares meals.

We deliver to Millstadt • Smithton • Freeburg • Paderborn

The meals are delivered between 11:00 am and 12:00 noon, Monday through Friday in Millstadt and Mondays in other areas that include 1 warm and 4 frozen meals. **Weekend meals** are now available.

Your volunteer driver can deliver your meal to the door or bring it to the kitchen for you, whichever you prefer.

Each nutritious meal is approved by a Registered Dietitian and supplies 1/3 of the daily dietary needs for an older adult.

Entrees include beef, chicken, pork, fish, and pasta.

You'll receive a new menu at the beginning of each month, so you can see what meals will be delivered. The cost of the meal is approximately \$11.90. We suggest a \$4.50 donation. However, we will not turn anyone away who cannot contribute.

You must be home when we bring the meals. We cannot leave meals outside for sanitary reasons. We also want to see how you are doing and find out if you need anything. Your meal will be delivered around the same time, so you'll know when to expect us.

You can begin receiving meals right away and we will make every effort to start delivering meals to you as soon as possible. We are also needing volunteers from Smithton and Freeburg to help deliver meals. If you want to sign up for meals or to volunteer or learn more, call (618) 476-3731 or email us at seniorce@htc.net

Farmers Market Coupons Benefit Local Seniors

AgeSmart representatives came to Millstadt Township Senior Center on Wednesday, July 25th to give eligible senior citizens coupons for locally grown, fresh fruits, vegetables and herbs at approved farmers markets and roadside stands.

The Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program is a federally funded program administered through the state Department of Agriculture. Qualifying seniors age 60 and older each receive \$25 as an incentive to buy healthy food from local farmers, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

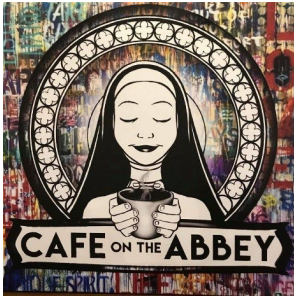
USDA established the program in 2001 to improve the diets of seniors. The 2014 Farm Bill maintains the current funding of \$20.6 million a year through 2018. Less than one-third of senior citizens in the United States eat the recommended amount of fruits and vegetables, which are essential to preventing health problems, according to sustainableagriculture.net. Seniors are eligible to receive coupons if gross household income (before taxes) is \$22,459 for a one-person household; \$30,451 for a two-person household.

If you missed the date at Millstadt Senior Center, eligible seniors can pick them up at AgeSmart Community Resources located at 2365 Country Rd, Belleville, IL 62221. They are open Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

Coupons are distributed first-come, first-served and photo identification for proof of age and residency is required. If you can't get to a distribution site, a proxy can be designated to pick up and redeem checks. Proxy forms are available also at AgeSmart.

Millstadt Farmers Market is located at the VFW and is open every Friday from 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm.

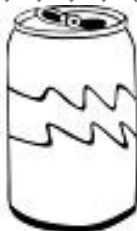

Phony Money Passed At Paderborn Picnic



At the St. Michael's annual church picnic held on July 7, 2018, a phony \$5.00 was passed at one of stands. The fake money was detected by the bill counter at the bank when the deposit was made.

Earlier in the summer counterfeit \$20.00 were passed in at least two businesses in Columbia. A

man used two of the counterfeit bills at Marie's Ice Cream Shoppe and another bill was also passed at the local McDonald's.

Businesses are advised to use counterfeit banknote detection pens to prevent the passage of fake bills. How can you tell a fake \$5.00 bill from a real one?

- If Lincoln is wearing a Cardinal cap, it's a fake bill;
- If ink rubs off in your hands, it's a fake bill;
- If the paper feels slick or too thick, it's probably a fake bill.

The counterfeit \$20.00 bills had the same serial number. Instead of the name "Jackson" under Andrew Jackson's face it read "This is a replica."

The suspect was reported driving a red pick-up truck with a yellow decal on the tailgate advertising "Clean Money." His money may be "clean" but not real.

These cases are under investigation. Anyone with information is asked to call the Columbia Police at 281-5151 or Millstadt Police at 476-7250.

New Medicare Cards



In May, Medicare began the year long process to replace current Medicare ID cards. The new cards are in the mail now for most of the Midwestern states, including Illinois. All new cards will be sent by next April.

Fraud schemes are still being conducted, mostly by phone. As a general rule, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) does not contact enrollees for Medicare numbers or other personal information, unless they have been granted permission in advance. The only time you might receive a legitimate phone call from Medicare is if you have given CMS permission to call in advance. If you are not certain a call from Medicare or Social Security is legitimate, hang up and call the agency back on the customer service lines: 1-800-633-4227 or 1-800-772-1213 for Social Security.

You might also get a call from Medicare if you have left a message requesting a call-back.

If you have been a victim of a Medicare fraud Scam, notify your bank and credit card providers. AARP also maintains a fraud hotline that can provide help at 1-877-908-3360.

Remember to shred your old Medicare Card when you receive your new card and have your new card laminated at the Senior Center.

Knowing who is at lunch at the Center is important for a number of reasons. First of all it's good to keep track so if someone isn't there for a few days we can contact them to make sure everything is ok. Second, when you sign in and are registered we are able to submit your name to receive our grant money to help pay for the meals. A way to look at it is that if you aren't registered and signed in we can't send a bill for your lunch to the Area Agency on Aging.
