





- 1 12 oz box Bow Tie Noodles
- 1/2 lb. Thick Cut Hickory Smoked Sliced Bacon, cooked crisped and diced
- 1 cup of cherry tomatoes cut in half
- 2 -3 green onions diced
- 1 1/2 cups Monterey Jack cheese grated
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 3-4 Tbsp BBQ sauce
- 1 tsp garlic powder.

- 1. Cook pasta according to directions in boiling water until cooked al dente. Drain and rinse.

#### Friends Give Update on Tin Man

The Friends of the Old Millstadt OLD MILLSTADT WATER TOWER Water Tower are approaching the half-way mark in their fund-raising campaign to get the Old Millstadt Water Tower repainted. As of November 25, 2018, they now have \$98,000, with a little over two vears to get to the goal of \$200,000.

"We've had a very busy year with a fundraiser almost every month," said Betty Keller Timmer, president.



"The car show in September was wonderful - we had perfect weather, which helped bring 103 vehicles. We are very thankful for everyone who came to the show and who volunteered", she added.

In addition to the fundraisers, donations have been on the increase this year. "All donations are welcome and very much appreciated - none are too big or too small!" Keller Timmer explained. Online donations may be made by visiting the Friends' website, www.millstadtwatertower.org, going to the "Support Shop" tab, and following the screen prompts. Checks may be made payable to:

The Friends is a 501 (C) 3 charity. Donors will receive an acknowledgement letter that can be used as an income tax receipt.

The Friends are continuing to recycle inkjet cartridges. Simply bring empty cartridges to Millstadt IGA, and the Friends will send them to recycling and then earn some money for the Tin Man.

Center on Wednesday, Oct. 24, from 1 to 3. This program will contain useful information for all Medicare beneficiaries, particularly those seniors new to Medicare. Advance registration is not required. Beginning on Tuesday, October 16 she will meet one on-one with individuals in the senior center regarding the Medicare Part D prescription drug program. LIHEAP HEATING 2019 The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)



# **Veterans Charity Scam**

From 2014 to 2017, charities associated with a Florida organization called Help the Vets raised \$20 million with patriotic, heartrending calls to aid veterans in need. "For thousands of disabled veterans who served in Iraq and Afghanistan, giving an arm and a leg isn't simply a figure of speech — it's a harsh reality," a typical fundraising letter read.

There was just one problem: According to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), almost none of that money went to help servicemen and women. Help the Vets spent 95 percent of donated dollars on administrative costs, compensation for its founder, and more fundraising. The now-defunct organization was targeted as part of a massive 2018 crackdown on a particularly shameful subset of charity fraud: scams that exploit Americans' gratitude for military members' service and sacrifice.

Sham veterans charities don't just steal or misspend your money; they divert millions of dollars that might otherwise flow to the many honorable organizations providing mental health care, housing, job training and other vital services to veterans and their families. Older people can be especially appealing targets, the FTC says.

These outfits use the same outreach techniques as trusted charities — letters, phone calls, email, texts and often adopt similar names, but they rely on deceptive pitches and high-pressure tactics to wear down donors. A little research can go a long way in weeding out phony appeals. Don't let scammers curb your generosity toward those who serve — but take steps to ensure your donated dollars truly support them.

#### Warning Signs

- Pressure to donate immediately. A legitimate veterans charity will welcome your donation whenever you choose to make it.
- Claims that you'll get a prize or win a sweepstakes if you give. That's illegal, according to the FTC.
- A thank-you for a donation you don't recall making. Phony fundraisers try to trick you into thinking you've already given to the cause, to lower your resistance to donating "again."







Emma and Liam are America's most popular baby

names for 2017. This marks the first time Liam has bested the boys, beating Noah for the top spot, and the fourth straight year for Emma. Liam first crawled into the top 10 in 2012 and has been reaching for the highest honor ever since. In other huge baby name news, Michael has been bumped from the top 10 for the first time since World War II, landing at number 12 this year. Emily also fell out of the top 10 for the first time since 1990. There are several new names in the top 10-Amelia and Evelyn make the list--Amelia for the first time since 1915. These traditional names show parents are keeping up the trend of naming daughters after grandmothers. Logan and Oliver are new for the boys, both making their first appearance on the list.

Berryhill encourages everyone to visit the agency's website to enjoy the baby names list and create a *my* Social Security account at www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount. *my* Social Security is a personalized online account that people can use beginning in their working years and continuing through to the time they receive Social Security benefits.

Social Security beneficiaries can have instant access to their benefit verification letter, payment history, and complete earnings record by establishing a *my* Social Security account. Beneficiaries also can change their address, start or change direct deposit information, and print a replacement SSA-1099 online. People receiving benefits can request a replacement Medicare card online.

Individuals age 18 and older who are not receiving benefits can also sign up for a *my* Social Security account to get their personalized online *Social Security Statement*. The online *Statement* provides workers with secure and convenient access to their Social Security earnings and benefit information, and estimates of future benefits they can use to plan for their retirement.

The agency began compiling the baby name list in 1997, with names dating back to 1880. At the time of a child's birth, parents supply the name to the agency when applying for a child's Social Security card, thus making Social Security America's source for the most popular baby names.

Each year, the list reveals the effect of pop-culture on naming trends. This year reality television seems to have influenced Mom and Dad.

Ensley was the fastest riser on the girls' list, moving 1,461 spots to number 965, from number 2,426 in 2016. Spring has sprung, and Wells (meaning "spring") had the biggest bloom in popularity for the boys, moving over 500 spots in 2017 from number 1,419 to 915. Perhaps his parents are fans of the hit TV show "The Bachelorette" where one of the popular contestants was named Wells. Does this mean more bachelors named Wells at future rose ceremonies?

In a clear nod to the popularity of the First Lady of the United States, new parents chose the name Melania at an increasing rate in 2017.

It looks like new parents are "Keeping up with the Kardashians" as the name Dream rose 840 spots in 2017. Fan or not, many people know Rob Kardashian and Angela White, aka Blac Chyna, named their daughter Dream in late 2016. For the boys, another fast riser was Nova, who may have gotten his popularity from all those Villanova Wildcats basketball fans naming their sons in celebration of the 2016 NCAA Men's Basketball Champions.
