Whether you spell it bunco or bunko, this dice game has come a long way from 1855,

when a shady character introduced it in San Francisco.

In those days, separating citizens from their money was the goal — not playing for innocuous prizes. In the early 1900s, the game became so popular that every large city had a bunco parlor. Then it fell out of favor, only to return in a big way during Prohibition. By then, bunco was associated with scams, swindling and confidence games. In fact, the detectives who raided the gambling parlors in speak-easies were known as the "Bunco Squad."

But there is nothing unsavory about the game these days. Its popularity grew again in the 1980s; now, just about every church, sorority and senior citizens group has a bunco night, which is described as fun, fun, fun. Millstadt Township Senior Services will hold <u>Bunco on Thursday, March 19, 2020</u>. Mark your calendars, the event will be held at St. James Parish Center located at 405 West Madison, Millstadt. Chickpea Pasta Salad in a Mason Jar

This is recipe for those who made a New Year's Resolution to eat healthier and to prepare more meals at home.

1/4 cup red onion finely chopped

3 T. red wine vinegar

1 ½ T olive oil

Salt and pepper

½ cup canned chickpeas, rinsed

1 cup grape tomatoes, halved

2 T. Kalamata olives, halved

1 cup cooked rotini pasta

1 ½ cups baby arugula

2 T crumbled feta cheese

In 1 quart jar, shake onion, vinegar, oil and pinch each of salt and pepper. Add chickpeas and gently shake to coat. Top with tomatoes, olive, pasta, arugula and feta. When ready to serve, turn upside down and let sit 2 minutes so dressing can run over rest of ingredients



Millstadt Township Senior Services To Provide Phone Reassurance To Seniors

Recent studies show that loneliness and isolation are leading contributors to decline, both mentally and physically, in seniors. As one study conducted by the University of California, San



Francisco found, those age 60 and older who reported feeling lonely saw a 45 percent increase in their risk of death, while isolated respondents had a 59 percent greater risk of mental and physical decline than their more social counterparts.

Millstadt Senior Center will begin offering a program that will provide critical socialization services, enabling seniors to remain in their own homes for as long as possible.

We will be calling anywhere from 2-7 days a week 365 days a year from the hours of 8 and 5. We will also try to add home visits to many of the seniors in the program.







December 9, 2019

The meeting was called to order by Mike Todd, with the following trustees answering to roll call: Randy Burk, Mike Capell, Ray Famula, Al Lehr, and Mark Todd. Trustee Mike French was absent. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

A motion was made by Ray Famula to approve the November 25th minutes. Mike Capell seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

COMMUNICATIONS OR CORRESPONDENCE: Mayor Todd stated the Board received a

PERSONNEL: Mike Capell stated there would be an Executive Session to discuss police personnel after Citizen Comments.

PUBLIC WORKS:

SEWER: Al Lehr stated he talked with Brian. He has been pressing sludge and doing general maintenance. The Parkview lift station had to be fixed; there were dish towels wrapped around the pump. On Saturday, November 30th they were called out for the pump at South Polk Street and West Madison Street. Mayor Todd stated they received work permit approval from St. Clair County for a 300-foot extension on the Saxtown Water Main. They are still waiting on permits from the IEPA.

STREETS, ALLEYS AND SIDEWALKS: Mayor Todd stated the Explosion baseball team would like to hold a free electronic recycling event at the park. Randy Burk made a motion to allow the Explosion baseball team to hold a free recycling event at the park near the volleyball court on Saturday, January 11th from 8am to noon. Al Lehr seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Randy stated that at the previous meeting, he passed out the info for the Streetscape project. The projected cost is on the high side because originally the street lights were going to be replaced. There is also a grant for \$245,150 that was received for beautification and enhancements along West Washington Street to North Monroe Street. Randy Burk made a motion to approve the local public agency agreement for federal participation for the amount of \$200,350. Mike Capell seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Randy stated the Friends of the Old Millstadt Water Tower are requesting street closures for their annual marathon. Randy Burk made a motion to close the first block of South Breese Street and the first block of East Madison Street on Sunday, May 31st from 6:30am to 12:30pm for the 3rd Annual Friends of the Old Millstadt Water Tower half marathon and 5k. Mike Capell seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously. Scott Baltz stated they are working on the new sidewalk in front of Trinity Lutheran Church. It is almost down to Wheatridge. They finished the work on the sidewalk on South Tyler Street on Thursday, December 5th.

ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS: Mike Capell stated Resolution 19-14 is for Spike's

Public House. St. Clair County denied their entrance on South Jefferson Street. This resolution is to request that the County approve the proposed entrance. Mike Capell made a motion to approve Resolution 19-14 as presented. Ray Famula seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

PARKS, POOL AND RECREATION: Mark Todd stated the Trustees had received the concession stand report. It wasn't great but it was one of the wettest seasons. The Trustees also received the pool report. Even with all the rain, the pool only lost \$14,000 which is less than the previous couple of years. Mayor Todd stated the pool is a service for the community and will always lose money. He thanked pool manager Ashley Crannage for her part in having a successful year. The splash pad also contributed to bringing more people in. Mark stated the Trustees also received the Biathlon report. The profit was \$10,000

Mark stated the rocket ship slide is down. The iron workers now have it and are trying to fix it so it can be reattached.



CEMETERY: Scott Baltz stated they cleaned up the bushes in the cemetery. COMMUNITY CENTER: Ray Famula stated Patty was able to get a new computer with the grant from Age Smart. Everyone at the Senior Center received a flashlight for Christmas. There will be a trip to Heimos Greenhouse

on Tuesday, December 10th.
PLANNING COMMISSION & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT: none

TIF: Mayor Todd stated the Annual TIF meeting will be held in January. He will get with Lisa Bowman and Rick Holmes to set the date.

PUBLIC SAFETY:

Police Department – Lieutenant Alan Hucke stated their annual Toy Drive is going on.

They have received a surplus of presents and MAC Medical donated 20 bicycles.

OLD BUSINESS: Melissa Helfrich gave a six month update on the mill. She stated there has been a lot of word of mouth talk and many visitors, including archeologists. There is a team working on getting it on the National Register. There is a team working on getting something together for the Smithsonian due to the fact that it is an intact factory with turn of the century equipment. They were asked not to remove anything to show how everything was processed. They were also asked not to paint the building because it damages the brick. The next step is to put together a team of people to do a PBS style documentary who will then put together a plan. Mayor Todd asked if there is a timeline for the construction plan. Melissa answered that there isn't.



Social Security Launches New Campaign to Fight Scammer

The Social Security Administration launched a new Public Service Announcement (PSA) campaign to continue warning people about the ongoing nationwide telephone impersonation scheme. The PSAs feature a message from Social Security Commissioner Andrew Saul. Social Security and its Office of the Inspector General (OIG) continue to receive reports about fraudulent phone calls from people falsely claiming to be Social Security employees. The scammers mislead victims into making cash or gift card payments for help with purported identity theft, or to avoid arrest for bogus Social Security number problems.

"I want every American to know that if a suspicious caller states there is a problem with their Social Security number or account, they should hang up and never give the caller money or personal information. People should then go online to oig.ssa.gov to report the scam call to Social Security," said Commissioner Saul.

People should also be on the lookout for a new version of this scam. Fraudsters are now emailing fake documents in attempts to get people to comply with their demands. Victims have received emails with attached letters and reports that appear to be from Social Security or the OIG. The letters may use official letterhead and government jargon to convince victims they are legitimate; they may also contain misspellings and grammar mistakes.

Social Security employees do occasionally contact peoplegenerally those who have ongoing business with the agency--by telephone for business purposes. However, Social Security employees will never threaten a person, or promise a Social Security benefit approval, or increase, in exchange for information or money. In those cases, the call is fraudulent, and people should just hang up.

Generally, the agency mainly calls people who have recently applied for a Social Security benefit, someone who is already receiving payments and requires an update to their record, or a person who has requested a phone call from the agency. If a person is not in one of these situations, they normally would not receive a call from the agency.

Social Security will not:

- •Tell you that your Social Security number has been suspended.
- Contact you to demand an immediate payment.
- Ask you for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Require a specific means of debt repayment, like a prepaid debit card, a retail gift card, or cash.
- Demand that you pay a Social Security debt without the ability to appeal the amount you owe.
- Promise a Social Security benefit approval, or increase, in exchange for information or money.

If there is a problem with a person's Social Security number or record, in most cases Social Security will mail a letter. If a person needs to submit payments to Social Security, the agency will send a letter with instructions and payment options. People should never provide information or payment over the phone or Internet unless they are certain of who is receiving it.


