Jean told how Mr. Krome who owned Millstadt Creamery, would give free ice cream cones to all the kids at the Annual Millstadt Homecoming.

Medicare Savings Programs

The Medicare Savings Programs, available through State of Illinois, Department of Human Services (DHS) could pay your Medicare Part B monthly premium of \$134 This can save a Medicare beneficiary \$1,608.00 a year.

There are three levels of the program Your gross income determines the category for which you qualify. All three levels pay Medicare Part B premiums. QMB also pays Medicare copays and deductibles on Medicare covered services. Income limits per month are below.

QMB \$1,037for a single person and \$1,397 for a couple

SLMB \$1,238 for a single person and \$1670 for a couple

QI-1 \$1,390 for a single person and \$1,876 for a couple

Once on MSP you will automatically be eligible for The Low-Income Subsidy (LIS), which is an extra benefit from Medicare to assist with Medicare Prescription Drug Coverage (Part D).

Extra Help will:

Help pay Medicare Part D monthly premium

Eliminate Medicare Part D yearly deductible

Reduce Medicare Part D drug co-pays (\$2.55 generic/ \$6.35 brand)

Plus, never hit the donut hole as long as you qualify for this program

Pantry at your Door is for those who are Disabled, a Senior and without transportation to get out and


shop or get to a pantry.

Boxes are delivered once a week to your front door. We do not go thru fenced back yards. If you would be so kind to have something like a table or chair where we may set your box up on to prevent maybe an animal getting to it.

Also, delivery is mainly on Wed afternoon or Thurs late morning, we recommend you be home during that time in order to care for any perishable items that may be in your box.

PLEASE NOTE, we cannot promise you any certain food as these food items are given free from businesses and vendors. Milk will keep up to a week after expiration date if it is kept properly closed and, in your refrigerator, (we have been told). Eggs can be kept for several weeks. Meat that we received is frozen

Meals On Wheels Available In Your Area

Millstadt Township Senior Services will deliver more than 11,000 meals this year. But you're nourished by more than just the food. Our volunteer drivers make a personal connection and check that you are okay. Meals are provided based on need, not on income.

We deliver meals to seniors (60 years or older) who are homebound, no longer driving, unable to prepare food themselves, and do not have a caregiver that prepares meals.

We deliver to Millstadt • Smithton • Freeburg • Paderborn

The meals are delivered between 11:00 am and 12:00 noon, Monday through Friday in Millstadt and Mondays in other areas that include 1 warm and 4 frozen meals. **Weekend meals** are now available.

Your volunteer driver can deliver your meal to the door or bring it to the kitchen for you, whichever you prefer.

Each nutritious meal is approved by a Registered Dietitian and supplies 1/3 of the daily dietary needs for an older adult.

Entrees include beef, chicken, pork, fish, and pasta.

You'll receive a new menu at the beginning of each month, so you can see what meals will be delivered. The cost of the meal is approximately \$11.90. We suggest a \$4.50 donation. However, we will not turn anyone away who cannot contribute.

You must be home when we bring the meals. We cannot leave meals outside for sanitary reasons. We also want to see how you are doing and find out if you need anything. Your meal will be delivered around the same time, so you'll know when to expect us.

You can begin receiving meals right away and we will make every effort to start delivering meals to you as soon as possible. We are also needing volunteers from Smithton and Freeburg to help deliver meals. If you want to sign up for meals or to volunteer or learn more, call (618) 476-3731 or email us at seniorce@htc.net







Friends of the Old Millstadt Water Tower. They have held three fundraisers that have added almost \$10,000 toward the goal of \$200,000 to get the Old Millstadt Water Tower repainted.

But, they are not done, merely shifting into another gear.

"We have some more events scheduled for the summer. Clay and Tammi Sutter, owners of Noble Shire Carriages, have offered to provide

trolley rides for the benefit of the Tower," explained Betty Keller Timmer, Friends president. The rides will take place on Sunday June 10, beginning at 1:00 at the pavilion behind Millstadt Consolidated School, at the intersection of North Monroe and West Gooding streets. Rides will cost \$10 for adults to children age 6. Children sitting on an adult's lap will ride for free. Advance tickets will be available at Millstadt IGA through June 9.

Betty added, "We recommend getting tickets in advance, since there are only a limited number of seats available on the trolley. Marianne Schaefer and I will narrate the rides, which will last approximately 45 minutes, and will highlight some of the historical sites in town."

Light refreshments will be available for purchase at the pavilion.

A returning event is the Friends' annual bake sale and tee shirt sale at Millstadt IGA, 625 East Washington, on June 16, starting at 7:30 a.m. "We are very fortunate to have so many talented bakers, both members and non-members, who willingly bake for us whenever we ask," Betty noted. Last year's sale netted over \$1,400.




