

13th Annual Millstadt Community Good Friday Cross Walk Set

The Millstadt community Good Friday Cross Walk will be held on April 19, 2019.

It will begin at noon in the parking lot of Millstadt Baptist Church at 310 South Veterans Drive.

Walkers will take turns carrying a large wooden cross throughout the village.

A total of 7 stops will be made that include Millstadt Baptist Church, Christ Community Church, St James Catholic Church, Creason Funeral Home, Zion Evangelical Church, Millstadt Senior Center and Garden Place.

At each location, one of the phrases that Jesus Christ spoke from the cross (His last 7 words) will be stated, with a brief explanation, thought and prayer.





Completed applications are due April 1, 2019.







Village of Millstadt

January 14, 2019 Meeting

Public hearing held to annex the property at 3929 Urbana Road, owned by Robert and Cheryl Young, to the Village. Ordinance for annexation will be on next meeting agenda.

Randy Burke met with residents of the Briars subdivision about oiling and chipping. Most of the residents did not want their streets oiled and chipped. The Village would be willing to pay the cost of oiling and chipping if the residents would pay the difference for asphalt.

Happy 100th Birthday!

On November 11, 1918, the Armistice was signed! Hundreds, thousands, legions of Americans had saved the Tommies, the French, and other Allies in this great war against the Central Powers. The Lafayette Esquadrille, the 21st Base Hospital from Wash U./ Barnes, St. Louis, and the 101 men from Millstadt (their families and those who survived) celebrated the end of the draft, rationing, Liberty gardens, and the "war to end all wars."

Then more than 1000 officers and enlisted men met March 15-17, 1919 in Paris. Teddy Roosevelt was there. Officers had proposed an organization of American Expeditionary Force veterans to boost troop morale and continue comradery. At this March meeting, a temporary constitution and name – The American Legion – were proposed. At a second meeting May 8-10, 1919 in St. Louis, the drafted constitution and name were adopted. The U.S. Congress chartered The American Legion in September 1919. At the first national convention in Minneapolis during November 1919, the preamble, constitution, and name were officially embraced. The founding missions of the Legion included programs for the relief and employment of veterans and Americanism programs for the communities.

Veterans returning to Millstadt followed these events. On January 15, 1920, fifteen to twenty men met and organized American Legion Post 502. Dr. G. J. Diesel was the first Commander. Initial membership of about 75 was anticipated. During later years, membership was opened to those who had served during war years. The local ladies organized the Women's Auxiliary Unit of Millstadt Post 502

American Legion in November 1920. Mrs. Irene Maserang was the first President. The Unit planned to assist the Post in ministering to the needs of disabled veterans and bring aid to community problems and issues. Mothers, wives, daughters, and sisters of exservicemen could join.

In Millstadt, the Legion/Auxiliary was at first physically located in the Fire Company Hall. Then, the Legion built a "log" structure at the corner of West Washington & Polk (Millstadt Carpet). Then, the Legion bought the Liederkrantz Hall and park at the north end of town. In 1975, this property was sold, and they continue to meet in other facilities.

In 1929, three Millstadt veterans attended the National Legion Convention in Paris, France (Barney Hirsch, Irwin and Armin Kern). Throughout the years, the Post and Unit have participated in local poppy sales, picnics/ dinners, Memorial Day services, school awards, sent youth to Boys and Girls State, contributed to veteran's hospitals and homes, and conduct services upon the death of local members. Today the Legion and VFW Post 7980 work together in supplying flags to veterans' graves at local cemeteries and to local schools and churches.







