

Supplemental The Commodity DOCIONK Food Program (CSFP) is а St. Louis Area Foodbank supplemental food source for seniors age 60 and older who fall within 130% of the federal poverty guidelines-seniors may participate in this program while also receiving food assistance via food pantries, meals on wheels, and/or SNAP (food stamps). The Foodbank partners with an organization that elects to administer the CSFP boxes to gualified seniors. Millstadt Township Senior Services would receive a once a month free delivery of free boxes to be distributed to the seniors signed up for the program; each box contains about 16 shelf stable items, plus cheese. The program does require some administrative work including, application sign up and verification of seniors, maintenance of sign-in sheets, and re-certification of participants that may be conducted verbally every 6 months.

LIHEAP HEATING 2017 LIHEAP

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) started on October 1st this year. Households that meet income eligibility will receive a onetime grant assistance paid directly to the utility companies. An applicant can only apply once in a program year.

To be eligible the following documents must be provided:

One of the unique and fun experiences in participating in Writer/Director, Dan Steadman's movies (www.Circa87.com) is meeting a delightful, diverse group of people of all ages! Dan's current movie, "THE RACKET", had its worldwide premiere at the historic Lincoln Theatre in Belleville, Illinois April 1 and April 8 with sell-out crowds and Red Carpet interviews.

Janet Baechle, 74, from Freeburg, Illinois was one of the four main characters. Her co-stars were Relanda Ledbetter of St. Louis, Helen White of St. Louis and Donna Delaney Cokenour of New Athens, Missouri.

Janet appeared in all but two of the many scenes. I admired her ability to memorize the lengthy script as she portrayed an 80 year old lady named "Winky". Eleven year old Jon Wesley Hopkins was a "shining star" as he captured the hearts of the audience as he portrayed Janet's great grandson. (See Jon Wesley at the Muny this year.)

"THE RACKET" is a comedy featuring four ladies the ages of "The Golden Girls" who were ousted from a multi-level beauty products marketing company because they did not have sufficient sales. They were very discouraged, formed a friendship, and started their own business selling "miracle water". The movie involved children who harvested the miracle water from the Crystal City Mine, located in Missouri. The sales people were millennial age who used social media to sell the water.

The movie was filmed in the Midwest cities of Collinsville, St. Louis, Fairview Heights, Crystal City, and several Belleville locations including Moore's Restaurant, Wirsing Manor, a historic home on Mascoutah Avenue built in 1837, and St. Paul United Church of Christ.

I had a small, speaking role in three of the scenes. Since the movie's focus is on seniors, I am contributing a DVD to the Millstadt Senior Center to use in whatever way Patty Evansco wishes to use it. It's a full-length feature film lasting 95 minutes. I hope you'll enjoy it and experience some fun and laughter as you do in the activities of the Millstadt Senior Center.




Can You Help?


Food Pantry Drive



SHIP Corner

Millstadt Township Senior Center Senior Health Insurance Program help

and we recently received our 2017 updated Manual. During the coming months I will be sharing with you some information that I feel is important and informational.

SENIOR NEWS

Organization and Administration of the SHIP Program: SHIP was initiated in July of 1988 by the Illinois Department of Insurance in response to the needs of Illinois' senior citizens regarding their health insurance. In April of 2013, under Executive Order by the Governor, SHIP was transferred to the Illinois Department on Aging.

The organizational structure of SHIP consists of:

• The **Illinois Department on Aging**, which provides initial training, continuing education and ongoing support of SHIP counselors;


• The sponsoring organization (Millstadt Township Senior Services), which provides coordinators, office space and office support services;

• The **coordinator (Patty Evansco)**, who is responsible for the administrative aspects of the SHIP program, which include publicizing SHIP services, recruiting volunteers, scheduling counseling sessions and responding to counselors' needs; and

• Counselor Patty Evansco meets with clients individually to provide objective information about health insurance, advocacy assistance, or referral if appropriate.

The state is divided geographically into four separate SHIP regions: Cook County, Northern Illinois, Central Illinois and Southern Illinois. Within each region, counselors are organized in to units that serve a specific geographic area, usually designated by counties.

Lower the Pressure

Your blood pressure, of course, measured as systolic and diastolic. Systolic is the top number and measures the pressure when the heart contracts and pumps blood. Diastolic is the bottom number, when the heart is resting and refilling with blood.

Both top and bottom numbers are important, but systolic pressure is more significant for cardiovascular disease.

Blood pressure can be lowered by: Lose Weight; Reduce salt intake, read labels;

Eat fruits, vegetables, low fat dairy;

Quit smoking, period;

Reduce stress;

Exercise, walking is great.


