Many Happy Returns

Taxes are no laughing matter. Unless, maybe, you have vour taxes done for free by at Millstadt Senior Center by AARP Tax-Aides, where tax season becomes a time of friendship, renewing old acquaintances and even sharing a joke or two.

On April 11th, Tax-Aide volunteers celebrated another successful season. John Johnson, Pat Sharkey, Dwayne Sanders and Carmen Perkins did 175 tax returns. Using the average cost for a tax service they were able to save these clients approximately \$36,355 and also pushed back Federal refunds of \$133,236 that were made largely by direct deposits.

The mission of the program, sponsored by AARP and the IRS, is to help people of low to moderate income over 50 years of age — although it's open to anyone, and the group is always seeking new clients.

And there gets to be a sense of camaraderie — clients and preparers recognize each other, and clients will sometimes recognize each other from past years and take tax preparation as a chance to catch up. There's a lot of back and forth and a lot of laughter and heartwarming.

National Pretzel Day

- Pretzels have been with us since the Middle Ages, possibly first made by Monks who thought the shape resembled arms crossing the chest.
- We all love salted pretzels but they can be made with no salt too. Unsalted pretzels are called Baldies!
- We think of the term "tying the knot" as pertaining to weddings. The term was inspired by pretzels. In Switzerland a newly married couple will break a pretzel on their wedding day to bring them good luck.
- Until the 1930s, pretzels were always hand made. The first automated pretzel machine was introduced in 1935.
- Pretzels seem to be the most popular in German and the USA. 80% of the pretzels sold in the US are manufactured in Pennsylvania.

The record for the largest pretzel in the Guinness Book of World Records is one that weighed 842 pounds and was 26 feet in length. It was made in Germany in 2008. Now that's a pretzel!

April 8, 2019 Village Board Meeting

Note, this is only a summary of the minutes at the Village Board Meetings. To see the complete report on Village Board Meetings, and Village Zoning Board meetings check on the web site for the Village of Millstadt.

Planning Commission meets at the Village Hall on the 3^{rd} Tuesday of the month at 7:00pm; the Zoning Board meets at the Village Hall on the 4^{th} Tuesday of the month at 7:30pm; The Village Board meets at the Village Hall on the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Mondays at 7:00pm.

ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS: The Zoning Board recommended approval of a rear set back of 4 feet and a parking variance of 22 spaces for the Millstadt Brewery.

Ordinance 1190, is an application to a zoning amendment to the 2nd addition of Alpine Trails. It is to change the zoning from R2 district to R1 district. Residents of Alpine Trails presented opposition to the zoning change. The zoning change would allow for smaller homes on smaller lots and current residents fear this could adversely affect the property value of their homes. Safety concerns were also expressed with increase in auto, foot and bicycle traffic.

Mike French stated Ordinance 1190 is for an application to a zoning amendment to the 2nd addition to Alpine Trails. It is to change the zoning from an R2 district to an R1 district. The Zoning Board recommended approval. Mike stated he believes there would be value in additional discussion regarding a compromise instead of declining the ordinance completely. Randy Burk stated he thought it best to vote on the ordinance and then go from there. Randy made a motion to deny Ordinance 1190. Al Lehr seconded the motion. Mike clarified that is would be denied with the thought there will be more discussion. The motion carried unanimously.

Mike French stated the Board received a letter from MAC Medical asking for "no parking" signs to be placed across from their entrance. They don't want vehicles getting damaged by the 18 wheelers that enter and leave their facility. Police Chief Ed Wilkerson did not see an issue with having the signs put up. The motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Todd and Randy Burk attended meeting regarding the proposed streetscape for West Washington Street. They will do stamped sidewalk and adding decorative lighting.

Mayor Todd stated Movies in the Park will be held on Friday, June 14 and Friday, September 13. Movies to be presented have not be announced.

Through the years the Fireworks Display and equipment utilized to shoot the fireworks has been updated to meet County, State and Federal fireworks standards and also to protect the volunteer personnel who wire and shoot the fireworks.

Every-one realizes how the cost of living has increased over the past 40 years. Well the cost of purchasing the fireworks has likewise increased considerably. Also the fireworks licensing fees and the volunteer's explosive license fees have gone from "0" to hundreds of dollars annually. None of the fireworks firing and wiring personnel receive any compensation. Millstadt has been very fortunate that annually, a large percentage of the local businesses and organizations have donated money toward the funding of the fireworks expenses. Additionally many Millstadt residents have contributed money for the fireworks. The fireworks committee would like to encourage additional financial help from the residents of the Millstadt area to maintain a quality display as in the past.







Howard loved fishing and playing cards. He was a veteran of the United States Air Force.


