36 Years Ago

October 18, 1983

This month marks the 35th anniversary of the Millstadt Area Community Center senior nutrition program. The program opened in the old Union Fire Company building located on the corner of South Jefferson and East Madison, where it still is today. The lunch was provided by the Belleville Area College Programs and Services for Older Persons. The center also had a pool table upstairs and tables set up for cards. The hours were from 10:00 am - 2:00 pm. The Millstadt American Legion donated \$500 to the center so that hardwood floors could be installed upstairs for dancing. The American Legion also donated some tables and chairs for use at the Center. The Millstadt Commercial Club donated \$4000 for a refrigerator, stove, cooking utensils, curtain rods and other items. The Township and Village received a joint grant of \$33,652 that was used toward the community center. Under the Village leadership of Mayor Gary Shondy the name was changed from "senior" center to "community" center because there are some people who feel they shouldn't be "seniors" until much later in life, if at all.

Millstadt Village Board Meeting September 9, 2019

A complete version of the Millstadt Village Board Meeting is available on line. Notes below are key points covered at meeting.

Streets, Alleys and Sidewalks; Randy Burk stated Millstadt received a 2019 grant to be used in 2020 for ADA improvements on the 500-600 block of Washington Street.

Randy Burk stated the driveway for new home on corner of West Laurel and South Taylor was poured to steep. Mayor Todd stated he talked to homeowner and builder that something needs to be done because what they did was not correct.

Ordinances and Resolution: Mike French stated Ordinance 1198 is to amend Chapter 51 (Sewers) and Chapter 52 (Water). It is the rate increase for sewer and water. The rate will go up 4% on January 1, 2020 and will increase by 2% each following year through 2026. Mike French made motion to accept Ordinance 1198 as presented. Al Lehr seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Corn Picking 1956 – Afternoon Break

I needed a heavy canvas jacket riding the cold red tractor, air an ice cube on bare skin. Blue sky over the



aspen grove I drove through on the way back to the field, throttle wide open, the empty wagon I pulled hitting the bumps on the dirt road. In the high branches of the aspens little explosions now and then sent leave tumbling and spinning like coins tossed into the air. The two-row, tractor mounted cornpicker was waiting at the end of the corn row, the wagon behind it heaped so high with ears of corn their yellow could be seen a mile away. My father, who ran the picker, was already sitting on the ground, leaning back against the big rear wheel of the tractor. In that spot out of the wind we ate ham sandwiches and doughnuts, and drank hot coffee from a clear Mason jar wrapped in newspaper to keep it warm. The autumn day had spilled the color gold everywhere: aspen, cornstalks, ears of corn piled high, coffee mixed with fresh cram, the fur of my dog, Boots, who was sharing our food. And when my father and I spoke, joking with the happy dog, we did now know it then, but even the words that we carelessly dropped were left to shine forever on the bottom of the clear, cold afternoon.

Corn Salad with Bacon and Honey

4 slices bacon, chopped 1 medium shallot, chopped 1 T. fresh thyme 2 teaspoons sherry vinegar 3 cups frozen corn, thawed 1 teaspoon honey

Fry bacon over medium heat until crisp. Transfer to a paper towel lined plate with slotted spoon; Add shallot and thyme to skillet, cook until tender 2-3 minutes. Add vinegar and corn. Cook, tossing until heated through, 4 to 5 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in honey and bacon. Makes 8 servings



The Millstadt Senior Center once again will be participating in Operation Food Search. Operation Food Search is a Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) a Senior Food assistance Program. What is the CSFP?

The Illinois Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) works to improve the health of older persons at least 60 years of age by supplementing their diets with nutritious USDA commodity foods. CSFP food packages do not provide a complete diet, but rather are good sources of the nutrients typically lacking in the diets of the target population. These include vitamins A and C, calcium and iron.

How does the program operate?

USDA purchases food and makes it available to IDHS along with

funds for administrative costs. IDHS distributes the food to public

and non-profit private local agencies from the USDA distribution

center. Local agencies determine the eligibility of applicants,

distribute the foods, and provide nutrition education. Local

agencies also provide referrals to other welfare, nutrition, and

health care programs such as WIC, food stamps, Medicaid, and

Medicare.

What are the requirements to get food through CSFP? Elderly must reside in the state of Illinois. Older persons must have income at or below 130 percent of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines.

What foods are provided to participants?

Food packages include a variety of foods, such as non -fat dry milk, evaporated milk, juice, hot or ready-toeat cereal, rice or pasta, peanut butter or dry beans or peas, canned meat or poultry or tuna or salmon or egg mix, and canned fruits and vegetables.


