Low Income Home Energy **Assistance** Program

Thursday, Oct. 22, 2020

LiHeap provides a one-time Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Progra yearly benefit to low-income households for winter heating bills. An overdue bill or disconnect notice is not required, nor do you have to own your own home or pay energy bills directly to be eligible for assistance. LIHEAP is administered by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity.

It is a federal program that provides utility bill assistance to those individuals who meet the income guidelines. Additional funding for the program has been provided under the federal CARES Act passed by Congress earlier this month to address the economic hardships caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

AgeSmart staff will be at the Millstadt Township Senior Center on Thursday, October 22, 2020 taking application. They will be wearing masks and gloves for handling your paperwork. Each client will be required to wear a mask for their appointment. This is not optional, and if you are not wearing a mask, you will have to reschedule your appointment for another time. Additionally, each client will have copies of their required paperwork made in advance of their appointment. Please know that we are implementing these measures to keep both our staff and participates safe as possible during this time.

The items you will need to have copied with you will be:


- 1. A current valid Illinois ID or driver's license for all household members-if they do not have one of these two, they can contact our office for other acceptable forms of ID
- 2. A Social Security card for all household members
- 3. The most recent power bill or bills (gas, electric, propane, etc.)
- 4. Proof of income for the last 30 days for all household members (If they have any questions about what proof of income is needed, please have them contact me prior to their appointment)
- 5. Rent receipt, lease agreement, or rent statement

As you can see, the list is smaller than in past years. A positive change is that there is no priority period. Any household that meets the income requirements will be eligible to apply from the start date of the program. Lastly, and probably the most important change, is the income limit. The LIHEAP program has increased the income limit from 150% of poverty level to 200% of poverty level. This means that individuals that did not qualify in years past might be eligible this year. The income by household size breaks down as follows:

Household size	30 day Income Limit
1	\$2127
2	\$2873
3	\$3620
4	\$4367



Carrot-Pepper Agrodolce

If you like sweet/sour dishes, or agrodolce, you will appreciate the following recipe. This works well with sweet peppers from your fall garden.

2-3 carrots-halve length then crosswise in 2-inch pieces.

4-5 mini sweet peppers-cut off stem, remove core, then quarter lengthwise.

3 tsps. Honey

1-2 Tbsp red wine vinegar

2-3 Tbsp golden raisins

Heat 1-2 Tbsp of olive oil on medium heat until hot. Add carrots, season with salt & pepper.Cook 4-6 minutes, stirring occasionally until slightly softened.

Add the peppers. Cook stirring occasionally, 3-4 minutes, or until slightly softened.

Add the honey, vinegar and raisins. Cook for another minute or until combined and the vegetables are coated.

Illinois Secretary Of State News

SPRINGFIELD — Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White on Tuesday announced that the expiration date for valid driver's licenses held by Illinois drivers who are 75 years of age or older has been extended for a period of one year past the licenses' current 2020 expiration date.


As a result, drivers age 75 and older with a 2020 driver's license expiration date do not need to visit a facility to renew their driver's license until shortly before their birthday in 2021.

Letters are being sent to drivers that qualify for this extension. The letter should be kept with the qualifying driver as further proof of the one-year extension. In addition, driving records on the Secretary of State's computer system have been updated to show the new 2021 expiration dates for qualified drivers, and law enforcement agencies both state and nationwide have been notified of the extended expiration dates.

White is reminding all other drivers that expiration dates for driver's licenses/ID cards and license plate stickers have been extended until Nov. 1, 2020. As a result, expired documents will remain valid until Nov. 1 so customers under age 75 do not need to rush into Driver Services facilities, especially during hot weather.



History Of The Millstadt Library



In January 1964, the members of Millstadt Civic Club,

federated women's organization with a limited membership of fifty, voted to establish a library for the community of Millstadt.

While the library committee, composed of ten members of the Civic Club, was busy assessing available housing, type of books most needed by the students in the community, and procuring the necessary materials; the other members of the club were diligently raising funds needed for the establishment of the library.

In April of 1965 an Open House was held for the Millstadt Library which had found free housing in a former one room schoolhouse, made available to them by St. James Church. This building was renovated by club members and their husbands.

In one year, the library had outgrown its facilities and an appeal was made to the Village Board to be included in plans for a proposed Municipal Building. The proposed building was to house Municipal Facilities, Fire and Police Departments and the Library. A referendum was prepared and presented to the voters, however it failed to receive the necessary ballots.

Another appeal was made to the Village Board requesting its help in relocating the library or renewing the possibility of plans for another Municipal Building, smaller and more conservative in scope than the plan previously presented. A building commission was established, and in due time another referendum was presented to the voters of the community, this time passing by a two to one margin.


Since its inception in January 1964 through March 1969, a conservative estimate of 6,000 hours have been donated by members of the Civic Club. \$9,786.51 has been raised by the Club and the amount of \$9,302.92 has been donated by other organizations and the individuals of Millstadt. The Millstadt Library has purchased \$6,570.64 worth of books and \$6,274.50 in furnishings and is presently nearing 6,000 volumes.

On February 3, 1969 the Millstadt Library occupied the new quarters in the Municipal Building and increased the time when the library is open from ten to fourteen hours per week.

The reality and success of the Millstadt Library would not be possible without the cooperation of the entire membership of the Millstadt Civic Club and without the support received from all of the individuals, businesses and organizations of the Community.

What Do Candy Corn & Stag **Beer Have In Common?**

Candy corn, that sugary treat popular around Halloween, can be traced back to the Goelitz Confectionary Company once located in Belleville on Mascoutah Avenue. The company was started in 1869 and retained ties to the Goelitz family who came to the United States



from Germany in 1866. The company remained in the Belleville area until 1986. In 2001 the company, known by the family name for four generations was renamed after one of its most popular candies. The Goelitz Confectionary Company was renamed Jelly Belly Candy

But the Goelitz family does not get the credit for inventing candy corn. An employee of the Wunderlee Candy Company in Pennsylvania named George Renninger is given the credit. He invented candy corn and the company marketed the "corn" as chicken feed. According to National Geographic about half of America's labor force was made up of farmers when the candy was invented, so there was an obvious tie-in and at the time corn was considered unfit for human consumption. Corn was tossed into the pigpen or chicken coop.

'Something worth crowing for' was the tagline on the advertisements and store displays, along with the picture of a rooster. While the Wunderlee Candy Company invented candy corn, the Goelitz family from Belleville gets the credit for making the candy corn popular.

Today, the company is based in Fairfield, California with a second manufacturing facility in North Chicago, Illinois. Now another Belleville product we are more familiar with, Stag Beer. In 1907, Stag was named by a customer in a naming contest for the new brand of beer and was developed by the Western Brewing Company in Belleville. Shortly after that, Griesedieck Brothers, the St. Louis company that produced Falstaff, bought Western Brewery and Stag in 1912. Stag Beer is now owned by the Pabst Brewing Company and made in Wisconsin.

Have some tri colored candy corn the next time you have a Stag and you will be honoring two former Belleville products. Prost!

Mike French made a motion to allow the Shriner's to hold their annual Paper Crusade from 8am to noon on Saturday, October 3rd, with a rain date of Saturday, October 17th, at the 4-way. Al Lehr seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously. Mayor Todd stated that Randy Burk met with TWM concerning the work on the 600 block of West Laurel. PLANNING COMMISSION & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT: Mike French stated the next Planning Commission meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, August 18th.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Emergency Service and Disaster Agency - Mayor Todd stated Scott Baltz has asked the siren company if the volume can be turned up on it. They are also looking into possibly

adding another speaker. BUILDING COMMISSIONER: Adam Romero stated he provided the trustees with information on what he has been working on. There are a few Zoning Board hearings coming up. Mayor Todd stated he and Adam have

gone over the fees for decks and fences. The Board will have the information at one of the upcoming meetings. OLD BUSINESS: Mayor Todd stated he received two bids to replace the retaining wall at the Alpine Meadows lift station. Mayer Landscaping bid \$10,950. Hank's Excavating bid \$8,000. Ray Famula made a motion to accept the bid for \$8,000 from Hank's Excavating to replace the retaining wall at the Alpine Meadows lift station. Mike Capell seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Mike Capell stated he is still communicating with CivicPlus on the new Village website. He talked with a rep and they will be sending him mock ups to review. Mayor Todd stated recently the Village entered an agreement with Everstream allowing them to dig into right-of-ways for broadband. There may be a similar contract to review for broadband from Clearwave. He has sent the information to Village Attorney Brian Flynn. ADJOURNMENT: Al Lehr made a motion to adjourn the general Village Board meeting and was seconded by Mike Capell. The motion carried unanimously.
