We are already in the last month of summer, and I hope all of you are enjoying the long, warm days and resting up for a fun filled fall. I almost want to knock on wood, but it is good to be back to normal.

I need to remind everyone that you must be sure to dial (618) in front of all numbers you dial now whether it is in town or out of town.

We are getting ready for our Fabric Grab on Saturday, August 27th. I never imagined we would get this much fabric, notions, thread, mats, sewing machines, quilting frames, machine surgers, etc. We have items we have not unpacked yet in bags and boxes. If you like sewing, you do not want to miss this sale. We could really use some help sorting and setting it out. If you have any free time the week of August 22nd, we would really appreciate your help.

I know many of you have Frontier telephones and they have not been working properly or not at all for nearly two weeks. I have called and emailed customer service regarding this problem and explained how important it is for seniors to have a telephone. My client had a neighbor who loaned her a telephone but was surely going to need it back. So last Friday I went to Dollar General and purchased a "burner phone" (I think I have watched too many FBI shows). They are really called a TracFone, and I hope I never have to rely on one for service. Once I got it together, it was horrible trying to figure out how to purchase minutes. There are so many decisions to be made such as "buy one time," "auto-renew minutes," "by time or minute purchase." It was a good thing I had not missed my blood pressure pill that day. Surrendering, I got the nerve up to call the 800 number for help. The gentleman was very kind and helpful. We had it all set up so that my client did not have to spend the weekend without a telephone. Yes, you guessed it! We forgot to ask one question; how do you dial out? I was not familiar with this type of phone, so the only number we had in it was mine from when we tested it. I thought of a solution without having to wait on hold at TracFone International again. I arranged for the client to touch my recent number on her screen if she had any problems and I would take care of it for her. She and I checked in with each other on Saturday and Sunday and everything was good. She now is signing up with Spectrum to get a working telephone. Her Frontier telephone has still not been repaired. I know they are busy, but I have people I worry about and want to make sure they are ok. The moral of the story is – always have a Plan B.

Several years ago, when Larry Sanders worked here, anytime the lottery would grow larger than normal, Larry would start a lottery pool. The Importance Of Power Of Attorney

About once a month someone stops in the Millstadt Senior Center office and asks for a Power of Attorney (POA) document. I want all Seniors to understand the importance of a Power of Attorney and for what it is used.

A Power of Attorney is a legal document that gives an individual the power to act on another person's behalf as either your Medical Power of Attorney and/or your Finance Power of Attorney. You should designate someone close (a relative or someone you truly trust) to be your Medical and Financial POA. Normally your Medical and Financial POAs are not the same person.

Medical Power Of Attorney - A Medical POA appoints an individual as a healthcare agent for another. Depending on the situation, this can allow the Medical POA the authority to do, for example, the following:

Direct the medical care that someone needs. For instance, if your father were ill or needed surgery and you were his healthcare agent, you could collaborate with medical professionals to determine the type of care he receives, the doctors and care providers who treat him, and even where he lives while he recovers. You will want to do what the person has told you regarding resuscitating measures and this will be clearly noted in the POA.

Financial Power Of Attorney - A Financial POA generally appoints an individual as a financial agent for another. Depending on the situation, this can allow the Financial POA the authority to do the following: -

Access someone's financial accounts to pay household and medical bills, manage property, file taxes, and apply for public benefits such as veterans benefits and Medicaid.

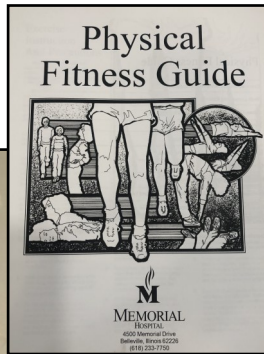
Keeping Our Vehicles In Top-Notch Shape

Mastering Aging Update

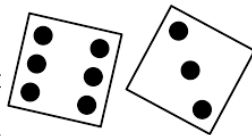
This week in our Aging Mastery Program class the topic was Falls Prevention. Carol Sauerwein, a physical therapist from Memorial Hospital gave the presentation and did an excellent job. She examines her patients and develops fitness and wellness-oriented programs for healthier and more active lifestyles. Did you realize that starting at 65 we begin to lose 45% of our muscle strength? It is hard decision to make, but we must start exercising consistently to live longer. Make it part of your lifestyle at least three times a week and you will see results. Carol had handouts for each member of the class. They included "Physical Fitness Guide" and "Home Exercise Program" both are great guides to begin an at home exercise program. If you would like a copy, please stop by and I will be glad to share with you. Next Tuesday, August 2nd at 10:00 am the topic will be Medication Management and will include a pharmacist discussion involving Multiple Medications, Alternative Approaches to Medication and Medicare Part D, Disposing of Medicines Properly, and My Drug Diary. This last class will be August 16th. We are hoping to schedule on Fridays "Living a Healthy Life with Chronic Conditions" This class will educate people with chronic diseases such as COPD, high blood pressure, arthritis, anxiety, fibromyalgia, and more, on improving life skills required to live well with a chronic disease. These skills include meal planning, stress management, relaxation techniques, safe and effective exercise strategies, and communication skills. Bunco Boom

On Tuesday, July 19th the Millstadt Senior Center held Bunco. There were 3 teams of 4 players that rotated tables. It started out kind of rowdy but calmed down after everyone figured out who was leaving and who was staying. The once quiet room was suddenly filled with laughter and yelling. Bunco is a game of chance, popular with all ages. This was our first week having it in-house at the Senior Center and we only played one session. We usually hold Bunco as a fundraiser once or twice a year. We will play Bunco again on Wednesday August 17th at 1:00 pm. This time we will collect \$2 to get in and \$1 toward the pot and \$1 for 3 raffle chances to win a grand prize.

There are usually two sessions of the game with six rounds each (like the six sides of a die). In each round, your goal is to match your roll with the number of the round. For example, during the sixth round, you want to roll at least one "six." If you do, you can keep rolling until you don't throw any sixes — each matching die equals one point. And, if you roll three sixes in one go, you get bunco, which is worth 23 points toward your overall score. (There is also 5 points given for any three-of-a-kind rolled, which is different than getting "bunco.") The players with the top points, take home some of the pot. Friendship and fun are really the draw for bunco players and most other games played at the Senior Centers.

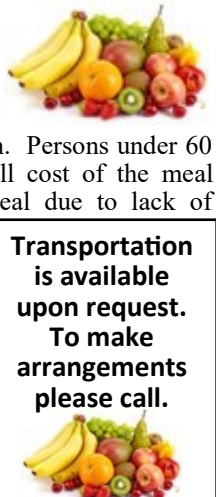

Senior Social Services Information

Benefit Access

What you will need to bring when filing for benefit access:

You will need to bring your Social Security 1099, completed income tax forms and W2 forms (if you are filing prior to tax day, April 15, you will need last year's 1099 and taxes and as such after tax day, April 15, you will need your current year 1099 and taxes), as well as your spouse's information. If you do not file taxes, you will need to sign a paper when you have your application submitted.

Benefit Access requirements:

1. Age

- you must be 65 years of age or older by December 31 of the current year; or
- you must be 16 years of age or older and totally disabled before January 1 of this year.

NOTE: "Person with a disability" means a person unable to engage in any substantial gainful activity by reason of a medically determinable physical or mental impairment which can be expected to result in death or has lasted or can be expected to last for a continuous period of not less than 12 months.

2. Residency

- you must live in Illinois at the time you file your application.

3. Income Limit Eligibility for the License Plate discount and/or Ride Free Transit Card: (Income limit increase effective 1/1/2020.)

Your total income last year must be less than

- \$33,562 for a 1 person household (yourself only); or
- \$44,533 for a 2 person household (yourself and your spouse, or yourself and one Qualified Additional Resident); or
- \$55,500 for a 3 person household (yourself, your spouse and one Qualified Additional Resident, or yourself and two Qualified Additional Residents).

NOTE: You must include your spouse's income if married and living together on December 31 of last year. If your spouse died last year, you would file as single and claim only your income. Do NOT include the income of a Qualified Additional Resident.

Eligibility is good for two years under the Benefit Access Program. The two-year period starts the date your application is approved. You may file again beginning 90 days before your eligibility expires.

Who qualifies as disabled?

To qualify as disabled, you must be at least 16 years of age prior to January 1 of the current year and be determined totally and permanently disabled from one of the following:

- Social Security Administration (Get Your Social Security Benefit Verification Online with mySocialSecurity), or
- Veterans Administration, or
- Civil Service, or
- Railroad Retirement,

or have one of the following:

- a Class 2 disability card from the Illinois Secretary of State's office, or
- a completed Physician's Statement that meets the total disability criteria established by the Social Security Administration.

Who is a Qualified Additional Resident?

A Qualified Additional Resident is an individual, other than your spouse,

- who lived with you in the same residence last year and this year up to the time you file your Benefit Access Application; and
- for whom you, or you and your spouse, provided more than half of that person's total financial support last year; and
- who is not or should not be filing a separate Benefit Access Application.

Qualified Additional Residents are not eligible for benefits.

What if I am NOT a U.S. citizen?

You do not have to be a U.S. citizen to qualify for a license plate discount or ride free transit card. However, you must have a Social Security number to fill out a Benefit Access Application. In the case of a married couple both individuals must have their own Social Security number. Qualified Additional Residents must also have their own Social Security number.

What if I am married?

- If you are married and you and your spouse lived together on December 31 of last year, you must complete one Benefit Access Application and report your total combined income. Your spouse cannot apply separately.
- If one or both of you resided in a nursing home, you should each complete a separate Benefit Access Application.
- If you and your spouse were permanently separated on December 31 of last year and are living at different addresses, you may each complete a separate Benefit Access Application, but may be required to prove that you are not living together by sending us legal separation papers from the court, divorce papers or a US1040 for each, indicating separate addresses.
- If you are a surviving spouse as of December 31 of last year, then you should file as single using only your income from last year.

New Medicare Enrollees Info

You have a 7-month window to sign up for Medicare.

- 3 months prior to your 65th birthday
- The month of your 65th birthday
- 3 months after your 65th birthday

If you are already collecting Social Security, you will automatically be signed up to start Medicare on the month of your 65th birthday.

If you are not collecting Social Security, you will need to create a sign on and password with Social Security.

If you have already created your Social Security account, you will need to bring your sign on and password to your appointment. For more information, please contact the Millstadt Senior Center at 618/476-3731.

How To Get Help From Social Security

Although we encourage using our online services, if your clients can't complete their business online, they can call us toll-free at **1-800-772-1213**. Our phone lines are usually less busy before 10 a.m. and from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. local time, and later in the week, or later in the month.

While appointments are **strongly recommended**, we continue to help people without one. An appointment reduces the wait time and ensures that your client knows what documents to bring, so we can help them in one visit. If your client needs to visit their local Social Security office without an appointment, we are here to help. Our offices tend to be less busy later in the day, later in the week, and later in the month.

Senior Health Insurance Program New (S.H.I.P.)

During the summer months, Medicare beneficiaries may find it beneficial to start preparing in advance for Medicare's annual enrollment period which begins October 15th and ends December 7th. In the fall, your drug plan or health plan will mail to you an Annual Notice of Change letter or "ANOC," which will outline all the changes that will be made to your plan beginning January 1st. Before you receive these letters, we recommend scheduling an appointment with your primary care physician to review any medications that you are taking. This is especially useful if you have medications prescribed by more than one doctor. You may want to discuss the effectiveness of the medications, the strength and dosage, and what alternatives are available. Having this conversation with your doctor at least annually will prevent you from taking medications that are no longer needed or no longer effective. You may also find it beneficial to talk to your pharmacist. This may also help you save money! How Do You Get A New Medicare Card?

BIBLE TALK

The Acts Of The Holy Spirit

Hello to all. Thank you for joining with me today to continue our study of the book of Acts. Chapter 19 contains various plights Paul and his companions were subjected to during his second visit in Ephesus. His first visit recorded in Acts 18 lasted about three months. This second visit lasted about two and one fourth years.

Acts 19:1-7. Paul meets a group of twelve disciples. He asked them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?" They had been baptized by John who told them of the one coming after, but until they met Paul, they did not realize the "one coming after" was Jesus. "When Paul placed his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them and they spoke in tongues and prophesied."

Acts 19:8-12. God worked extraordinary miracles through Paul, but many refused to accept Paul's teachings. Paul left the synagogue and took those who believed with him. He continued teaching in the lecture hall of Tyrannus. (Tyrannus could have been the name of the school, but it is believed to have been the name of a Jewish school master who was greatly affected to the Christian cause and bravely allowed Christian meetings at his school).

Acts 19:13-22. Paul's dealings with the exorcists. They claimed they could expel evil spirits while Paul taught, we could resist evil spirits by faith in Christ. We are now introduced to two special friends of Paul's who are traveling with him. (Paul mentions them fondly in his letters included in the Bible. Gaius: Acts 19, Roman's 16:23. The apostle John also speaks well of Gaius in 3John:1-14. Aristarchus: We know very little of his past or about the rest of his life, but Paul valued his friendship and refers to him in Acts 19:29, Philemon 1:23-24 and Colossians 4:10).

My Bible refers to Acts 19:23-41 as "The Riot in Ephesus". This section is not too difficult to understand. The Temple of Artemis in Ephesus was one of the original Seven Wonders of the World and a very popular tourist attraction in the Roman world. (A money maker.). Demetrius, as well as others earned an income by crafting tiny silver shrines which sold quite well to tourists. Concerned that Paul would destroy the profits of his sales, Demetrius stirred the crowds with his comments. "And you can see and hear how this fellow Paul has convinced and led astray large numbers of people here in Ephesus and in practically the whole province of Asia when he says man made gods are no gods at all ". Eventually the city clerk (Records keeper) saved Paul and his companions. The clerk knew that Rome would not interfere unless there was a riot and dismissed all charges against them and saved not only Paul and his companions but his own skin as well. (Note: The Temple of Artemis is no longer standing).

The book Acts is often referred to as The Acts of the Apostles. The book records the acts of the Holy Spirit working through different people. Open your heart and let the Holy Spirit of God work through you! Blessings and peace, *Pat Morris*

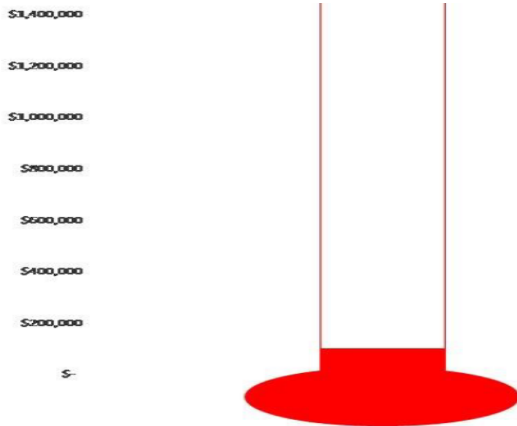

Combine all ingredients, except green beans, in sauce pan and heat until cheese is melted.

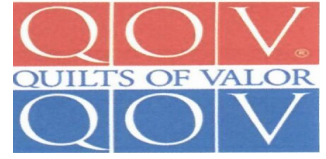


DID YOU SIGN IN?

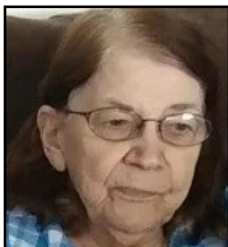

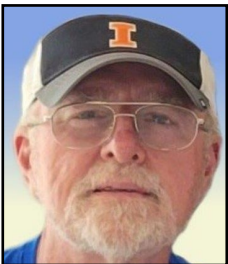
Dennis Shelton
